A Medical Liability System That Works For Patients and Our Economy

Patients for Fair Compensation is seeking to replace our broken medical liability system with a no-blame, administrative compensation system. The Patients' Compensation System will lower healthcare costs by reducing the practice of defensive medicine, saving up to \$650 billion per year nationally in unnecessary costs. By assuring access to real justice for injured patients and increasing patient safety, the system is one that works for patients and our economy.

Defensive Medicine *noun*

The practice of ordering medical tests, procedures, or consultations of doubtful clinical value in order to protect the prescribing physician from malpractice suits.

Cost of Defensive Medicine?

- > Up to \$14 billion per year in Georgia¹
- > \$6.9 billion in taxpayer savings over 10 years (Medicaid/SHBP)

Physicians Practice Defensive Medicine for Two Reasons

- > Abhor adversarial litigation process
- > Liability and personal financial exposure

Problem for Patients

- > Limits access to justice and doesn't provide enough compensation
 - Less than 20% of injured patients receive compensation in current system
 - Compensated patients receive only 17.5% of malpractice costs
- > Decreases patient safety
 - Physicians are not sharing best practices
 - New life-saving medical techniques are not being used
 - Patients are undergoing excessive testing

Source of Funding

Entire system is funded by administrative fees collected from physicians with no cost to taxpayers.

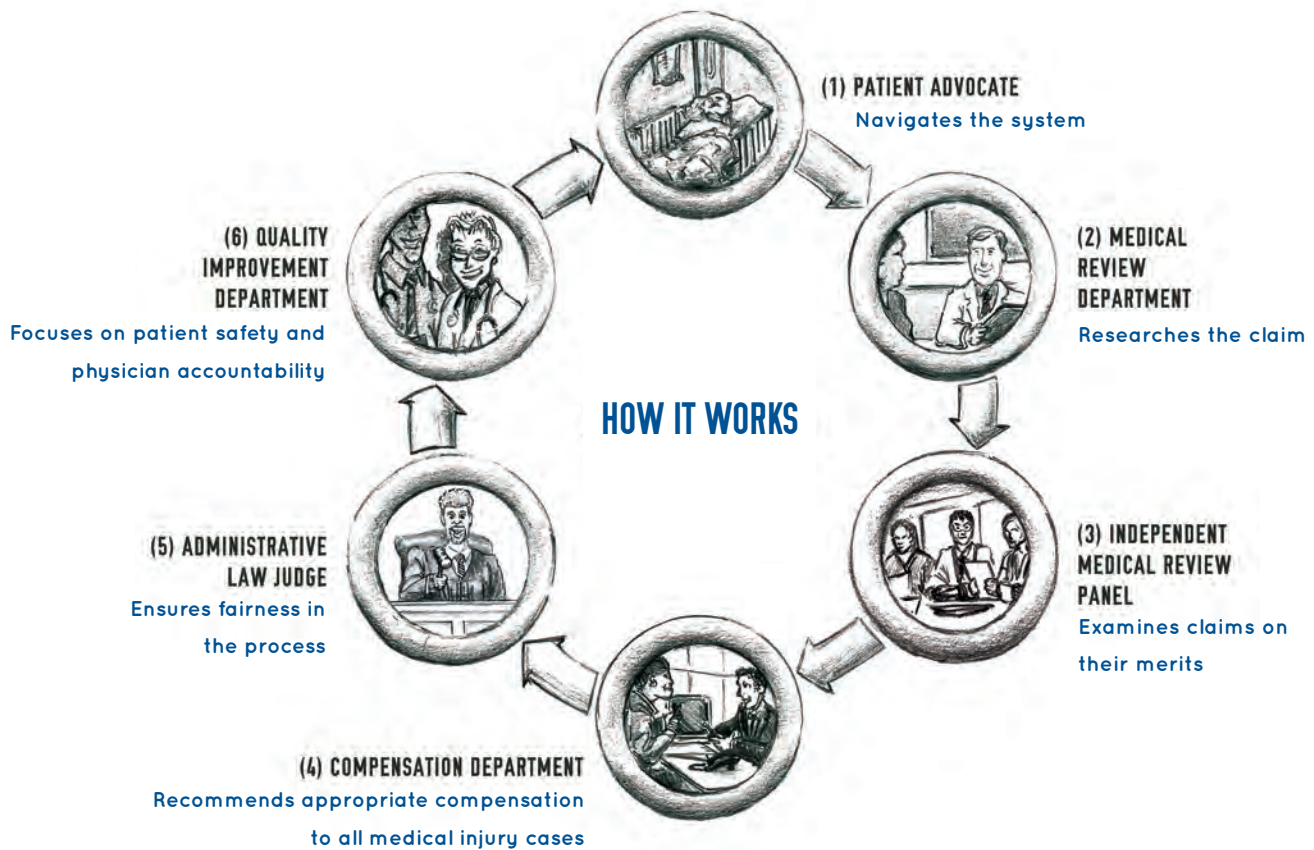
More Narrow Focus

The new Patients' Compensation System (PCS) applies exclusively to Georgia physicians. This more narrow approach will allow the PCS solution to focus on creating a better, safer healthcare system in Georgia.

Patient Benefits

- › Access to justice for all patients – all patient complaints are heard
- › More compensation paid to more patients
- › Faster guaranteed payments (years faster)
- › Eliminates unnecessary tests and defensive medicine
- › Increases patient safety

Economic Impact & Benefits

- › Public Sector Benefits:
 - Savings to State of Georgia is \$6.9 Billion (\$3.1 billion in Medicaid & \$3.8 Billion in SHBP) in first ten years
- › Private Sector Benefits:
 - Employers and private health insurance payers would realize savings between \$15 billion and \$31 billion in first ten years
 - Employers would achieve savings of 10% - 21% of the cost of providing health insurance per employee per year
 - Employers could create 22,000-45,000 new jobs with savings from PCS solution
